Next Ward Panel Meeting

The next public ward panel meeting is on **Thursday 23rd July starting at 7pm** at the Purley SNT Base, Whytecliffe Road South. This meeting is open to the public and gives them the opportunity to voice concerns and issues in the Purley area.

Promises

Actively monitor the activities and behaviour of beggars and ASB in the Brighton Road/High Street area.

The team have received no reports of begging in the Purley Town Centre since the last newsletter was sent out in July.

We continue to monitor all calls relating to anti social behaviour on the ward and work with colleagues from the council to tackle any issues raised. One main issue which is still reported is the anti social behaviour caused by groups of youths in vehicles. The two main areas effected by this remain the mutil storey car park on Whytecliffe Road South and the Capella Court car park. If any residents have been affected by this or know any information relating to those responsible please make contact with the team.

To tackle this problem the team are working with the owners of Capella Court and the council who are responsible for the multi storey.

Patrol high priority burglary hotspot areas and conduct at least one street briefing in a burglary hotspot area a month.

Both foot and mobile patrols are conducted by the team with the PCs conducting both uniform and plain clothes patrols. Both Street briefings held in July were well received by residents with more attending at each briefing. Two have been planned for July with dates and times below. These streets have not been burglary hotspot areas but have had other issues raised with the team.

Hereward Avenue junction with Wyvern Road - Monday 13th July, 6-6.30pm Purley Vale junction with Elm Road- Friday 24th July, 6-6.30pm

Again these roads will have leaflets delivered prior to the street briefing taking place.

Conduct two road watch scheme a month

Two schemes where conducted in June by our volunteers and team. One was on Riddelsdown Road on the 19th were 20 vehicles were recorded speeding. The second was on Foxley Lane on the 26th were 47 vehicles were recorded speeding. All those recorded speeding have been sent warning letters making them aware of the speed they were travelling at the time.

Priority Crime

The priority crime for Purley LPT remains as burglary and theft from motor vehicle.

Burglary

In June there were 12 burglaries reported in total: 7 non residential, 1 attempted non residential and 4 residential.

There has been a rise of five burglaries in total compared to May where 7 were reported in total the main rise has been with non residential burglaries.

The non residential burglaries reported have been a mixture of premises other than houses and garages. With the garage burglaries the main items looked for by suspects are bikes, power tools and historically alcohol has been taken.

For residential burglaries the main method of entry remains to be breaking in through the back of the property. This is done by either breaking glass in patio and kitchen doors or in a ground floor window. The main items that have been reported stolen are cash, jewellery and small valuable items that can be sold on easily.

The residential burglaries that have been reported have mainly occurred during the day or early evening whilst residents are out and the properties are empty. The non residential burglaries have occurred over night when there is less visibility.

The roads that have been affected by recent burglaries are: Highfield Road, Pampisford Road, Selcroft Road and Riddlesdown Avenue.

Theft from Motor Vehicle

In June 13 reports were made for theft from motor vehicle on the ward.

Out of the 13 reports made 4 relate to theft of number plates with 3 of those reports for vehicles parked on Warren Road in the parking bays. The team continue to patrol this area throughout the shift and signs have been put up by the council regarding cameras which they have but up near the bays which are reviewed by the team.

The majority of the other reports made relate to work vans being broken into overnight or whilst left unattended and tools being taken.

We strongly advise residents who have work vans to remove tools overnight and fit more then one lock to the vehicle for extra security. The secure it scheme is still on going at Foxley Motors. You can attend the garage which is on Foxley Hill Road behind the Shell petrol station on Godstone Road. Staff there will fit anti theft screws to your registration plates free of charge. There is no appointment needed the fitting takes around 10 minutes.

Other Crimes

These include robbery and violence against the persons (VAP) crimes which will include figures for offences of; common assault, actual bodily harm, grievous bodily harm and affray. Public order offences have also been included in this table. The figures provided exclude those related to domestic abuse reports.

One of the robberies reported in June took place in Rotary Fields; an arrest has been made relating to this. One took place near Montpellier Road and one near Warren Road at this stage no arrests have been made relating to these.
