NEWS AND ADVICE

Robbery - Limpsfield Road

On 15th May 2017 an armed robbery took place at a shop on Limpsfield Road. The suspects stole around £1000 and left the scene within minutes. Thankfully, no one was hurt in the incident. With the help of the shop's CCTV and several eye witnesses, we were able to identify and arrest the suspects. Enquiries are still ongoing.

Fraud Prevention Advice

We have received a number of reports of victims falling prey to courier fraud scams. Victims received telephone calls from someone claiming to be from their bank. Unfortunately the victims were deceived and lost thousands of pounds in the process. If you spot a scam or have been scammed, report it and get help. By reporting incidents you will make it more difficult for fraudsters to deceive others. Remember, your bank or police will never arrange to collect your bank cards.

RESPONDING TO YOUR CONCERNS



You said: You are concerned about Burglary in the area

We did: We have been advising residents on how to stay secure this summer. Leaving ground floor windows and doors open in the summer can give burglars the perfect opportunity. If you're off on holiday and wish to post anything on social media, make sure your posts aren't public and that they're only seen by your friends. Leave lights and a radio on a timer to make the property appear occupied. Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property or join a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.



You said: You are concerned about Vehicle crime in the area

We did: Officers in plain-clothes and in uniform are on patrol in order to target and arrest motor vehicle crime suspects and to deter them from committing crime in these areas. Since our last Newsletter we have only had one theft from motor vehicle - this is a reduction from ten incidents this time last year. We ask that remain vigilant and do not leave any valuables inside your vehicle. Think about where you are leaving your vehicle overnight and what security measures you are taking.



You said: You would like us to tackle Anti-Soical Behaviour near shops and the schools

We did: The team continues to work hard to reduce all forms of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) on the ward. We have been working with Croydon Council to help reduce ASB around these locations, conducting joint ASB patrols across Sanderstead. Our main ASB locations are Wettern Tree Gardens and the Recreation Ground where we have had a number of stops. Patrols are conducted around schools and places where students congregate to prevent ASB and help keep students safe.
